ELIGIBILITY TO REGISTER TO VOTE

- A United States citizen
- A Michigan resident for at least 30 days by Election Day
- At least 16 years old to pre-register and at least 17.5 years old to register (must be 18 years old by Election Day to vote)
- Not currently serving a sentence in jail or prison

Michigan requires proof of residence for voter registration. Acceptable proof includes: Michigan Driver's License or State ID, Current Utility Bill, Bank Statement, Paycheck or Government Check, or other Government Document.

VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINES

OCTOBER 21ST, 2024

Last day to register online or by mail

OCTOBER 22ND - NOVEMBER 5TH

Register to vote in person at your local clerk

ABSENTEE VOTING DEADLINES

SEPTEMBER 26TH, 2024

Absentee ballots and dropboxes are available and start to be issued

NOVEMBER 1St, 2024 AT 5:00 PM

Deadline for online and mail absentee ballot applications

NOVEMBER 4TH, 2024 AT 4:00 PM

Deadline to request your absentee ballot in person at your local clerk's office

NOVEMBER 5TH. 2024 AT 8:00 PM

Deadline to return your absentee ballot to your local clerk's office

Your ballot should be RECEIVED by your Local Clerk's Office via mail or in person no later than 8:00 PM on election day.

MAKE A PLAN TO VOTE

VOTE BY MAIL

- Request your absentee ballot at: linktr.ee/chalovoteMl
- Ballots can be mailed or dropped off at your Local Clerk's office before Election day at 8:00 PM

EARLY IN-PERSON

- Monday October 7th Early voting may begin in some counties. Check your county website for more details.
- Saturday October 26th to Sunday November 3rd Mandatory early voting required by all counties

VOTE ON ELECTION DAY

- Polls will be open on election day from 7:00 AM 8:00 PM.

- Michigan requires a photo ID to vote in an election. Voters who
 do not have an ID or forget their ID will still be able to vote
 upon signing a sworn affidavit.

TIPS & RESOURCES

- It is recommended to mail your ballot at least 7 business days at the latest before the deadline to make sure the ballot is received by the municipality. If you are within 7 days we recommend dropping off your ballot at your local clerk's office instead of mailing it to ensure it arrives safely.

- When filling out a paper ballot make sure to select only one option for each election or question and fill in the oval completely with a black or blue pen.
- Unhoused individuals can register to vote by listing a street corner, shelter, park, or any other place you usually stay as your address. An ID is not required to register to vote, but proof of residency needs to be presented.
